FINANCIAL SECRETARY'S UPDATE

Hi everyone! Another year has come and gone and it is membership renewal time again! Well, I think we can all agree that this has been the strangest year ever! We all know how Covid 19 has affected our personal and business lives. We have also felt the impact up on the Hill. Revenue is way down as we still haven't been able to re-open our Barroom. Participation has been down across the board. The state and local municipalities keep raising rates on taxes, permits and license fees. For example; our liquor permit went from \$300.00 last year to \$2,000.00 this year. It is for these reasons that the Board voted to raise the renewal fee by \$10.00 this year.

Your renewal form is accompanying this newsletter. We had to slide our Variable Assessment amount up a bit to make ends meet for this year. Your renewal will be \$200.00. The dues allocations for this upcoming year will be \$90 for dues, \$50.00 for our variable assessment, \$30 will go to our capital fund, \$15 will go to our game program and \$15 will go to the purchase of fish for our stocking program.

We seem to be hovering just below 2,000 members so no big change there. At one time we had 3,400 members and a waiting list. Of those members roughly 15% are non-paying, senior members. This is my annual plea for you members to help us keep costs down by signing up a new member. Thank you to all who have brought a new or perspective member to the club!! This year we've gotten close to 100 new members. Let's keep it going!

Before the Pandemic hit, we were working hard to get some new programs started. We have a new Dog Train-

ing Chairman with some great ideas for new programs and Hunt and Field tests. . . all on hold presently. We've also established a new Women's Events Committee to attract more women to the shooting sports. We believe the means to get more kids and young people involved is to get their Mom's involved.

Remember, dues must be received by the club no later than October 1st or you will be dropped from the club roster. If You have a problem getting your dues in on time, let me know BEFORE OCTOBER 1ST!!! This will be your only notice so please renew right away so you don't forget. My wife forgot to send it in is not an excuse. If you are paying with cash, please leave your renewal with an officer and ask him or her to place it in the drop box. Oh, please ask for a receipt in case I make a mistake so you have proof of your payment.

SENIOR MEMBERS - Please return your renewal cards also. This is how we keep the database current and how we get you your newsletter. If the card doesn't come back, your name doesn't stay in the database so please return it. A small donation from the seniors helps greatly as well so please send in what you can. We really appreciate it!

Unfortunately, we've had to cancel our annual Field Day and Barbecue. We're hoping to bring it back bigger and better than ever next year. Keep your fingers crossed for the Game Dinner in January.

THIS AND THAT...

Please, be careful with firearms. Take that extra moment to be **safe**. Actions open when not engaged at the ranges, various games or hunting. Sportsmen must continue to maintain our excellent safety record. Don't be afraid to remind anyone with a closed action to open it.

You are empowered, as a member of this club, to enforce the rules of your club. If you see someone breaking them, show them your card, ask for their card and get their name. If they refuse, get a good description/license plate or take a picture with your phone. A serious violation should be brought to the attention of any Officer or Director.

Remember, when Upland Game Season begins, rifle, pistol, clays, archery ranges and fishing are CLOSED every day except Sundays! They will not re-open to daily use until after the CLUB season ends **January 9th, 2021**. There will be a fall stocking of the pond in the days before the opening of Upland Season. Remember, only Sunday fishing after Upland Game season begins.

NOTE: During any Trap or Skeet League, League members have shooting preference before the game opens to all.

UPLAND GAME REPORT

Buttons this year will cost \$50.00. They will be available most likely on Saturdays and Sundays and possibly at the October 6th Membership Meeting. Check the website or call. You will need a current hunting license and a 2020-2021 Club membership card in order to purchase a button. **REMEMBER** you must have a current button and wear it to hunt Pheasant on Club property every day, not just Saturday. This year the **BROWN** button will be for Saturday morning and the **GREEN** button will be for Saturday afternoon.

REMEMBER! Shooting time is 7:30 AM. This is for safety reasons. The Club property will be closed for hunting on Saturdays from 11:00 AM to 1:00 PM to facilitate stocking. So, the morning hunt will run 7:30 AM to 11 AM and the afternoon hunt will run 1 pm until ½ hour after sunset. During the week, we **NO LONGER** close between 11AM and 1PM and stocking will be random during the week.

For weekdays, hours will be 7:30AM until ½ hour after sunset. The Club will be open all day with hunting beginning at 8AM on Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve with only a morning stocking on these holidays so either color pin will work. **NOTE:** For Veteran's Day November 11th, hunting will start at 7:30 AM with a holiday stocking.

PLEASE NOTE AGAIN THE FOLLOWING RULES: You are NOT allowed in the woods and must remain in the parking lots before 7:30 AM (8 AM Listed Holidays) or between the hours of 11AM-1PM on Saturdays. **Please do not test us on this!**

For those who want to hunt small game, you will need a **YELLOW PIN**. It will clearly say **NO PHEASANT** on it and is free. This will allow you to hunt squirrels or other small game during Upland Season. You may not pick up or possess a Pheasant, even if you find one that died or you will be in violation of Club rules.

Make sure you affix your button firmly to your vest or cap. If you are caught hunting without a pin or hunting with the wrong color on a Saturday, you will have to appear before the Board of Directors to explain why.
